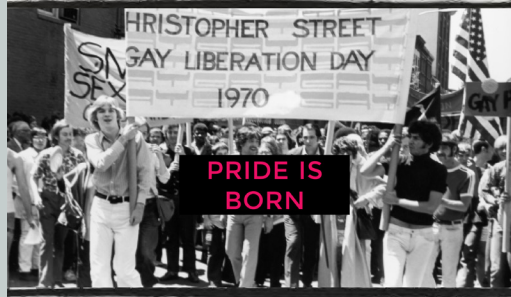

LGBTQ HISTORY TRAVELING EXHIBITIONS



The next year, commemorative marches and "gay-ins" were organized in San Francisco, New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles to coincide with the anniversary of the riot. New York's march started with tens of people, grew to hundreds, then to thousands as it entered Central Park.

The Los Angeles contingent enlisted the help of the American Civil Liberties Union to acquire a city permit and become the first LGBTQ march sanctioned by a city government. In the years following, the marches grew in size and participation, and spread across the world in cities small and large. Now known as the Pride Parade, this event serves as an annual reminder and celebration of the Stonewall Riots of 1969.
