### **Youth Ambassadors for Queer History**

In May, the ONE Archives Foundation welcomed our first group of Youth Ambassadors for Queer History, a mentorship and professional training program for a core group of high school student leaders from the greater Los Angeles area.

Starting in August, students will meet bi-weekly over eight months for scholarly guest lectures, field trips to significant LGBTQ historical sites, and hands-on research projects as they document the histories of local LGBTQ communities of color. Their collective research will be shared nationally in schools and community organizations through a series of History Panels produced by the ONE Archives Foundation.


## ONE Archives Foundation's History Panels on Display during One City, One Pride
