Thank you to our Youth Ambassadors for **Queer History Program Founders!**


ONE Archives Foundation is thrilled to announce it has received a \$50,000 grant for its Youth Ambassadors for Queer History program. The generous grant was received from Program Founders, Rob Saltzman and Ed Pierce. The grant will enable the ONE Archives Foundation to continue to grow its Youth Ambassadors program, which trains and mentors a core group of high school student leaders from across the greater Los Angeles area to become peer ambassadors for LGBTQ history and culture in their communities.

Program Founders, Rob Saltzman and Ed Pierce, have been strong supporters of LGBTQ organizations both locally and nationally. Rob and Ed met as students at Harvard Law School in the late 1970's. They were together as a couple for 36 years from 1979 until Ed's death in 2015 at age 63. Rob and Ed were legally married in California in 2008.
