Education Program Empowers High School Students Through Inspiring Interviews With Six LGBTQ+ Activists & Role Models

Los Angeles, CA (July 13, 2023) — ONE Archives Foundation announced today its 2023 Youspeak Radio Listening Party, a virtual event featuring highlights and reflections from six inspiring new interviews created by this year's Youspeak Radio participants. The event is free and will take place online on Wednesday, July 19 at 5pm PT / 7pm CR / 8pm ET. Listen to the 2023 audio trailer out now.

This culmination event is part of **Youspeak Radio**, an educational initiative from ONE Archives Foundation that pairs high school students with California-based LGBTQ+ activists for in-depth conversations that offer insight into our past as a community and ignite students' passion for changemaking. The 2023 cohort transformed these interviews into audio stories to be released on a weekly basis starting July 26. These six bright young students will share reflections on their experience in Youspeak, following an excerpt from their audio story, at the **Listening Party** next Wednesday, July 19.

The LGBTQ+ trailblazers featured in our 2023 Youspeak Radio episodes include: former Los Angeles City councilmember Mike Bonin; multidisciplinary artist Dorian Wood; drag queen and political activist Terence Alan Smith, also known as Joan Jett Blakk; psychologist and Bi+ activist Dr. Mimi Hoang; healer and trans community leader Reverend Valerie Spencer; and provost and historian Dr. Amy Sueyoshi. Each of these trailblazers expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to share their stories and connect with the younger generation.

"I am just so touched that ONE has this platform to help youth," said Mimi Hoang, internationally-recognized bisexual activist and psychologist and 2023 Youspeak Radio interviewee. "You are going to change the world. It makes me happy as someone who is older to be able to impart some of my experiences."

Youspeak Radio equips students with audio storytelling, oral history, and interview skills necessary to bring stories to life. The 2023 program is led by Trevor Ladner, ONE Archives Foundation's new Education Programs Manager. As a former K-12 social studies educator, Ladner champions initiatives to make LGBTQ+ history more accessible to queer and trans teens.

"In a time of old attacks on a new generation of LGBTQ+ people, I am inspired by the knowledge and passion that our youth fellows brought to their conversations with these trailblazers," said Trevor Ladner.


