Position Summary

The Director of Public Programs is an exempt, full-time position that oversees the creation, implementation, promotion, and evaluation of One Institute's Public Programs including **STORIES: The AIDS Monument** (in partnership with the City of West Hollywood), **Circa: Queer Histories Festival** during LGBTQ+ History Month (October), Archival Exhibitions, and other public programs held throughout the year, include Pride Month. This position reports to the Executive Director and supervises the Exhibitions and Public Programs Manager, as well as seasonal programming interns (i.e. Getty Marrow).

STORIES: The AIDS Monument is a new One Institute programming site in partnership with the City of West Hollywood. The AIDS Monument was founded by the Foundation for the AIDS Monument (FAM) and installed in West Hollywood Park in 2025. It was created to Remember loved ones lost to HIV/AIDS, Celebrate the activists and caregivers that fought for and
